Quick Guide to American Medical Association (AMA) Style

Researchers cite to document, acknowledge, and direct readers to additional resources.

- Do not cite a reference you have not read.
- List and number references in the order you cite them in a paper or presentation.
- Italicize and abbreviate journal titles according to their listing in **Journals in NCBI Databases** <http://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/nlmcatalog/journals>. If part of the title, state cities in parentheses.
- For journal articles and parts of books— capitalize only the first letter of the first word, proper names, and abbreviations. Subtitles follow the main title after a colon and a space.
- Italicize book and periodical titles and capitalize each major word.
- For print materials you cite, do not state a URL or date accessed.
- Do not enclose article and book chapter titles in quotation marks, unless part of the published title.

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Online Journal Article - Six or Less Authors* *Add ACP's proxy server prefix to URLs for e-materials licensed by the library, to enable access from off-campus:
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Online Journal Article - More than Six Authors* DOIs (Digital Object Identifiers) are preferred to URLs to state in a reference, when available. With inclusion of a DOI, no accessed date is then needed. The DOI would be the last element stated.
